

NORDLEY REGIS COURT ROLLS

These Manor Court Rolls were found in 2010 in a trunk at Astley Hall Farm. The trunk once belonged to Gladys Howard Thompson, author of "The Kings Lea" and held many documents concerning Alveley parish including a typed copy of these Manor Court Rolls. The originals were not found. It is presumed that the typed copy was undertaken at the request of Mrs Thompson. They contain a wealth of detail about the everyday lives of the people of Kingsnordley and are an excellent addition to the documentary archive of the parish.
